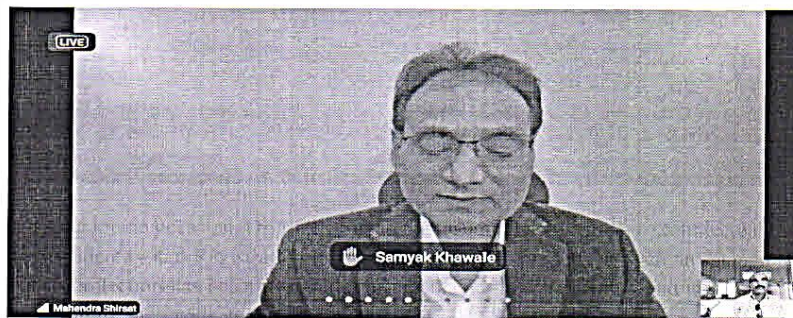

**Intellectual property is classified into four types as follows –**

- 1 Design / engraving and carving research
- 2 Copyright
3. Patent
- 4 trademarks / trademarks

The protection period of the same companion is 20 years which can be extended by re-registration. If intellectual property - design / engraving and engraving research, copyrights,

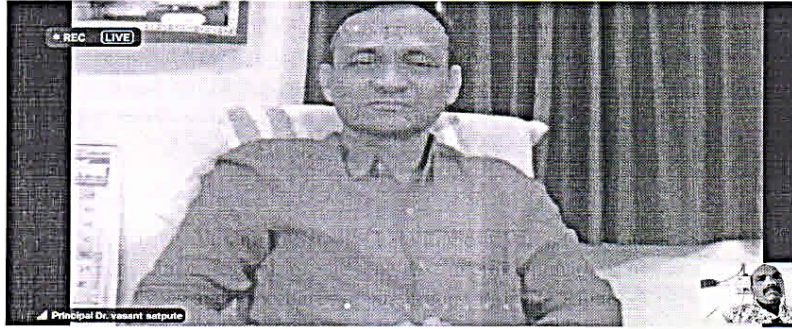


patents, trademarks (trademarks) are found to be infringed, a claim for damages may be filed against them or counterfeit research may be removed from the market.

Explaining that intellectual property rights are divided into copyright, patent, trademark, design / engraving and engraving research, natural indicators, he asserted that every country can use the world's best resources and achieve human welfare.
